## College of Arts and Sciences Undergraduate Courses

Internships are an important part of the undergraduate experience as they provide exposure to working in particular industries and help students explore career options. At Suffolk, students can earn credit for their internship experiences by registering for a course in a specific department. The chart below lists what internship courses are offered in each department within the College of Arts and Sciences, whether one is required for a major, and additional information needed to register.
