



Go to Class

Tutoring appointments are designed to complement your class, not replace it. In order to get the most out of your tutoring session, you must go to class and complete the assigned course work as well as you can.



Make Appointments Early

Appointments can be made up to three weeks in advance. Appointments fill up quickly, especially before exams so it would be best if you planned ahead and made your appointments early.



Plan Ahead

Come to the BLC with specific questions to ask your tutor. While it is highly unlikely that tutors will be permitted to help you directly with your homework, they can guide you through similar problems or questions to help you better understand how to approach course assignments on your own.



Come Prepared

Come to the BLC with your assignments, textbooks, notes, and syllabus.



Arrive on Time

If you arrive more than 15 minutes late to your tutoring appointment, you will be asked to reschedule. It is beneficial for you and respectful of your tutor for you to arrive on time.



Use Time Wisely

Tutoring appointments are 50 minutes long. Try to prioritize your needs, and only bring the materials that you can cover in that time period.



Ask Questions

Tutoring appointments are a great time to ask all kinds of questions – especially those that you may not have the chance to ask in class. Tutors are there to help explain complex concepts clearly and creatively.



Be Patient

The BLC tutors are students just like you. They may be highly knowledgeable in the subject that they tutor, but they do not know everything. They are also not meant to replace your professors. Please be patient as they are trying to help you.
