Further Neighborhood Action Inc. seeks to assist its guests in moving toward the long- term goal of taking charge of their lives.
- ***ABCD/ North End-West End*** Action for Boston Community Development is Boston's antipoverty agency, serving more than 100,000 low-income Greater Boston residents through its city-wide network of neighborhood-based organizations. ABCD provides innovative, timely programs that promote upward mobility and a higher quality of life for people and communities.
