Interested students should consult the instructor in advance.

Upper-class English majors may gain academic credit for work preparing them for an English-related career, provided that the work is monitored by a member of the English faculty. Department approval is required.

Interested students should consult instructor in advance.

Interested students should consult the instructor in advance.

PHILOSOPHY	Dr. Gregory Fried, Chair <a href="mailto:gfried@suffolk.edu">gfried@suffolk.edu</a>	PHIL 513 Internship in Applied Ethics*	<b>Pre-requisites:</b> PHIL 119 or 123 or 127 and consent of instructor <b>Course Credits</b> 4.00 <b>Description</b> Students in this course will serve as interns in a department-approved position with a service provider, professional organization, government agency, or non-governmental organization whose work is relevant to issues in applied ethics. A faculty mentor will meet with students regularly to develop individually designed programs of readings and to discuss this material and its relation to the internship experience. In addition to the substantial time commitment to the internship, course requirements will usually include a journal and a research project.

Restricted to majors only unless by permission of instructor. <b>Course Credits</b> 4.00 <b>Description</b> Focuses on interacting with others in a service environment in a professional role. Seminar emphasizes tools for interacting with recipients in a respectful manner, emphasizing strengths and resources of the recipient, and on sensitivity to various kinds of diversity in the service setting. Students work in service settings for a minimum of 6-8 hours per week during the semester, with most of that time in direct contact with service recipients. Internship arrangements must be made before the course begins.
SOCIOLOGY	Dr. Felicia Wiltz, Chair <a href="mailto:fwiltz@suffolk.edu">fwiltz@suffolk.edu</a>	SOC 483 Professional Practicum I*	<b>Pre-requisites</b> To be eligible for the course, students must be a Sociology major; have one full day free each week; must have junior status at the time of application; must be in good academic standing and in good standing with the Sociology Department. <b>Course Credits</b> 4.00 <b>Description</b> Students are provided with the opportunity to apply academic learning in a supervised internship consistent with their personal career goals or academic interest. The course covers such topics as career exploration and development, resume and cover letter writing, job fairs, and networking, and graduate school applications. In addition to the course assignments, students are required to complete a minimum full day internship each per week during the entire semester.
		SOC 484 Professional Practicum II*	<b>Pre-requisites</b> To be eligible for the course, students must be a Sociology major; have successfully completed Professional Practicum I; have one full day free each week; and must be in academic good standing and in good standing with the Sociology Department. <b>Course Credits</b> 4.00 <b>Description</b> Students are provided an opportunity to intensify or extend their internship experience. The course covers such topics as mock interviewing, informational interviewing, and job fairs.

At the successful completion of the internship, students will be required to submit a written analysis of their experience as well as a journal documenting the daily events of their project. Professional internships are difficult to secure. Interested students are advised to contact members of the Theatre Department faculty at least one semester in advance to facilitate the arrangement of this opportunity. Students will be assigned a faculty mentor to oversee their progress.

<sup>1</sup> For those **students participating in the Internship Program**, it is mandatory to take a 1-credit Tutorial in Business Spanish. In the case of students with native or similar level of Spanish, academic advisors may apply some exceptions to this rule.

<sup>1</sup> **Internship in Spain for Suffolk Students:** The Internship Program Fee of \$1,200 is due at the time of submitting your application for the Internship Program. This Internship Program Fee is non-refundable if the student decides to withdraw at any point after submitting their application for the Internship Program, even in the event that the student does not start or does not complete the Internship in Spain. If the student receives credit and successfully completes the Internship Program, Suffolk University students will be awarded an Internship Scholarship in the amount of \$600. This Internship Scholarship is available only to Suffolk University students; it is not available to study-abroad students coming to the Madrid Campus from other institutions or through study abroad agents.

<sup>2</sup> **Internship in Spain for Non-Suffolk Students:** The Internship Program Fee of \$1,200 is due at the time of submitting your application for the Internship Program. This Internship Program Fee is non-refundable if the student decides to withdraw at any point after submitting their application for the Internship Program, even in the event that the student does not start or does not complete the Internship in Spain.
