Institutional Credits/GPA is the number of required credits and minimum GPA you must earn at Suffolk.

Credits/GPA is the total number of credits you are required to earn.

Current Earned is your overall number of credits earned towards the required total (SU credit + any transfer credit)

Remaining is the total number of credits you have left to graduate. "Met" means that your current GPA has met the minimum cumulative GPA requirement.

Anticipated Additional is the number of currently registered credits.

Anticipated Remaining is the number of credits you will need if you successfully complete your currently registered courses.

The body of your Program Evaluation includes requirements for graduation. They requirements and major requirements. Your evaluation will indicate requirements you have completed or course requirements you have not yet started.

Core/General Education Requirements

Each set of requirements is labeled with a name.

Credits you have completed towards this set of requirements displays.

Each set of requirements is broken into sub-requirements.

Statuses are listed next to each requirement and sub-requirement. A status key displays at the beginning of your evaluation.

For example, this student has 'C'ompleted the Computer Literacy Requirement.

Included with each sub-requirement is a list of course(s) that can be taken to complete it.

Individual courses you have taken or are registered for will appear beneath the sub-requirement.

If a course has been completed, the grade received will appear, as well as the number of earned.

The term associated with the course displays.

Major Requirements
