

There are 3 ways to get a Management Internship

1. You find one through your own connections
2. You find one through Career Services
3. The Director of Internships finds an internship and we post it on the Facebook page

If the internship timing parallels any semester, and you have a 3.0, you can take MGT520, the internship course

1. Finding an internship through your own connections

- ▣ Connect with previous employers
- ▣ Ask your connections for ideas.
- ▣ Network with professional associations
- ▣ Simply find an organization and ask
- ▣ Look for job ads online like www.internweb.com
- ▣ Approach it like a job hunt
- ▣ Be creative!

2. Finding an internship through Career Services

- ▣ Go to <http://suffolk.experience.com/er/security/login.jsp>
- ▣ Apply online
- ▣ Work directly with the organization to arrange the internship

3. The Director of Internships finds an internship and we post it on the Facebook page

- ▣ These internships arise from existing SBS relationships
- ▣ They are posted online on the Suffolk University Management Major Facebook group (please ask to join if you haven't already)
- ▣ Professors may also post internships that they've found on the Facebook Group
- ▣ You apply to the professor who posted the listing who makes a decision based on your GPA and experience

Remember, as an intern

- ▣ You are an ambassador of Suffolk University to that organization
- ▣ If you represent Suffolk effectively, you open the door for future internships with that organization
- ▣ If you found the internship yourself through your connections and if possible, ask the organization if they would be willing to sponsor more Suffolk interns. If yes, have them contact, Professor Jodi Detjen, jdetjen@suffolk.edu
