00:15 Basically, what GIS does is it maps out data.  
00:18 We use it primarily in environmental data.  
00:20 Every environmental scientist these days uses GIS in some form or another.  
00:24 It's a great way to visualize information, taking large data sets,  
00:28 big data if you will, and represent it in a picture.  
00:31 A picture tells a thousand words.  
00:33 A map tells, oh, more than a million, I would say.  
00:36 So what we can do is take all sorts of data, visualize it, tell stories with it,  
00:41 break down information so that people can understand it.  
00:43 So, as we gain more and more data sets through the internet  
00:48 and through people's mobile devices, data is everywhere  
00:51 and we're entering the Information Age, if we're not there already.  
00:53 And GIS is a great tool for managing all of that information.  
00:58 So we have, you know, these COVID maps,  
01:00 unfortunately we've been seeing, as a product of GIS.  
01:03 We use GIS to map out water systems and electric systems and utilities.  
01:07 Every town uses GIS to look at parcel maps and things along those lines.  
01:12 So, we use a variety of tools here.  
01:16 We use Esri tools, ArcGIS.  
01:19 We use QGIS, open-source tools.  
01:21 We use Mapbox and CARTO.  
01:23 And we start to dig into the programming a little bit too.  
01:28 And we use drones.  
01:29 Drones are a great way to gather data that we can map.  
01:33 They fly over, they take pictures, they gather information  
01:36 with their sensors, and we map them out.  
01:38 So, I encourage you to talk to me if this information interests you,  
01:44 if this technology interests you.  
01:46 It's a great tool these days and you'll separate yourself  
01:49 from the competition when you go to get a job.  
01:51 So, let me know.  
01:53 I love to talk about GIS and maps.  
01:55 It's used in every industry, not just the environmental industry.  
01:59 So, let's talk.
