

Suffolk University is a private, non-sectarian, university located in Boston, Massachusetts with 8,046 full and part-time students. Founded as a law school in 1906 and named after its location in Suffolk County, Massachusetts, the university is co-educational and is comprised of the Suffolk University Law School, the Suffolk College of Arts and Sciences, the Sawyer Business School, and the New England School of Art and Design (NESAD). In addition to its main campus on Beacon Hill in Boston, adjacent to the Massachusetts State House and the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court, it also has a satellite campus in Lawrence, MA and in international campus in Madrid, Spain. The university occupies 16 buildings located on Beacon Hill and Downtown Boston, which includes 4 residence halls, two theatres, two galleries and three libraries.

Suffolk University provides an overall supportive academic research environment that will help to ensure the success of this research. The university has a strong reputation for fostering and supporting both basic and applied research that transcends traditional boundaries. Suffolk encourages the advancement of scholarly pursuits that enrich the local community and expand the boundaries of science.
