WELCOME TO THE SUFFOLK UNIVERSITY MCNAIR SCHOLARS PROGRAM!

The McNair Scholars Program at Suffolk University is a federally funded project designed to increase the number of underrepresented individuals pursuing doctoral study. During the academic year, the McNair Scholars are prepared for graduate work through involvement in research, faculty mentoring, academic colloquia series, and other scholarly activities. The McNair Scholars Program works closely with all program participants to achieve a high level of educational success and to complete their undergraduate requirements. All program activities prepare the program participants to be viable candidates for the McNair Summer Research Institute – a summer program designed to develop and conduct an independent research project under the supervision of a faculty mentor at Suffolk University. Program participants are expected to enroll in graduate programs and eventually complete a doctoral degree.

Eligibility and Selection Criteria

The McNair Scholars Program is highly competitive and serves a maximum of twenty-five students at any given time. New applicants are considered only once current scholars graduate from the university. Given the limited availability of student spots every year, meeting the eligibility requirements does not guarantee admission into the McNair cohort. Letters of recommendation, resumes, and personal statements are assessed by the program admissions committee to identify students who might benefit the most from our program offerings, who may have a strong commitment to undergraduate research, and whose goal is to complete an academic doctorate.

Students are eligible to apply if they are:

- A U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident
- A full-time student with at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA
- A sophomore or junior (with at least 12 months until graduation at time of acceptance)
 And EITHER:
 - A first-generation college student who is from a low-income household, OR
 - A member of a group underrepresented in graduate study

In addition, students must be willing to participate in the McNair Scholars Summer Research Institute, at least once, before graduation; present their research projects in at least two conferences (McNair or Academic conferences only); and have a commitment to participate in all McNair seminars, workshops, and activities until graduation.

Awards

Students must submit proposals to be admitted into the *McNair Scholars Summer Research Institute*. Scholars participating in this program will receive a monetary stipend upon successful completion of their research and submission of a final manuscript for publication in an undergraduate research journal. Students may also receive travel scholarships to attend conferences and potential graduate programs, waivers for graduate school admissions applications, and use of computing devices.

When your application is received, an academic transcript will be requested from the Registrar's Office and a Verification of Family Income will be obtained from the Office of Student Financial Services. Once these documents are reviewed by the program staff, an interview will be conducted with the applicant and a final decision will be made concerning their admission into the program.

An academic and professional resume should accompany your application. This document should include, but not be limited to, a list of academic honors, distinctions, scholarships, memberships in academic and extracurricular organizations, and participation in academic activities.

Be sure to include any research experience on the resume, as well. If you do, make sure to include the name of the faculty member or research supervisor under whom you conducted this work, and your primary responsibilities.

WRITING SAMPLE

You will be required to submit a writing sample with your application materials. The topic of the paper can be of your choosing, but it should be <u>academic in nature and include external references cited in the paper.</u> There is no length requirement for your writing sample. You do not have to write a paper specifically for the application. You are welcome to use a paper that you may have already written for a course at Suffolk University (final papers in research methods courses or in major-specific courses work well).

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

<u>Two</u> letters of recommendation are required for the application. Please use the forms provided with the application packet. One recommendation letters MUST be from a professor/faculty member at Suffolk University.
