**Transfer credit does not include Dual Enrollment, CLEP, IB, AP or other credits awarded through test. Credits are not issued for waived courses.

***Students required to complete ENG 099 may be allowed to waive WRI 101 with a grade of “B” or better and the approval of the English Department. Students who are invited to complete WRI 103 and earn a “B” or better satisfy the two Writing Requirements. Waiving a course does not earn credits.

† To fulfill the language requirement, a student must earn credit for a course in Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Greek, Italian, Spanish or Sign Language at the 102 level or above. A student may have to complete the prerequisite of 101 before taking 102. A student can test into 102 or waive the language requirements with proof of proficiency/skill at the 202 level in any qualifying language.
