- * Denotes a course that may double count toward major if taken at appropriate level. Double counting a course toward two requirements does not earn additional credits beyond the assigned number. Courses that count for "Social, Cultural & Global Perspectives (SCGP)" may double count towards other core requirements. Consult your major advisor.
- **Transfer credit does not include Dual Enrollment, CLEP, IB, AP or other credits awarded through test. Credits are not issued for waived courses.
- ***Students required to complete ENG 099 may be allowed to waive WRI 101 with a grade of "B" or better and the approval of the English Department. Students who are invited to complete WRI 103 and earn a "B" or better satisfy the two Writing Requirements. Waiving a course does not earn credits.
- ^Some courses may be designated as STE and have a laboratory. In the case of a course that is a lecture plus a lab, the student must complete both components to earn credit for the requirement.

PRE-BFA Advising

College of Arts and Sciences

Students applying directly to the BFA program as either a fine arts, graphic design, or interior design major are required to submit a portfolio as part of the admission process.

If you do not have a portfolio but are interested in the BFA, you can begin your studies at the University as "Undeclared Arts and Sciences." You should take courses your first semester in your **intended major** (fine arts, graphic design, or interior design).

Students who meet the following conditions will be exempt from the portfolio requirement and will be invited to join the BFA program:

- Complete Foundation Drawing I, 2D/Color and Integrated Studio 1 or Digital Orthographics (depending on your anticipated major)
- Earn a combined GPA of at least 2.7 in those courses, with no grade lower than a C+.

Students may petition the Foundation Portfolio Committee to review samples of their course work if the minimum GPA requirement is not met. Students also may solicit letters of recommendation from their professor(s) in support of their candidacy.

At the end of the first semester, students who are not invited to join the BFA program will be strongly advised to pursue another major at the University. Such students may apply completed studio courses to an art minor, or use them as electives per the approval of their major program of study.
