

Advising Grid for Students who enrolled in the BSBA *PRIOR* to Fall 2014

- First, review your Program Evaluation on *mySuffolk* and note the requirements you need to complete as well as the total number of credits you have outstanding. It is important to keep track of your remaining requirements AS WELL AS your total credits earned.
- Second, if there are no courses open that fulfill a remaining requirement in your program evaluation, refer to the table below for new options.

NOTE: If you take a course that doesn't fulfill a requirement in your program evaluation, you may apply it as free elective credits.
