The Suffolk University Political Research Center is making a clarification regarding Question 29 on its June 14 poll due to a change in the proposed referendum on the state sales tax. The question that was asked relied on an official filing that sought to reduce the state's sales tax figure to 4.5 percent. The Massachusetts retail industry has since adjusted its proposal to reduce the sales tax figure to 5 percent.

In September 2014, the Massachusetts Gaming Commission awarded a casino license to Wynn Resorts to build the Boston Harbor Casino located in Everett, Mass. In early 2018, a number of sexual misconduct allegations were made against CEO Steve Wynn, resulting in his departure from Wynn Resorts.

The information about Steve Wynn's sexual misconduct and private settlements with women was withheld from the Mass. Gaming Commission during the application process in 2014 and would have disqualified Wynn Resorts from getting the license if the information was disclosed.

The Massachusetts Gaming Commission opened an investigation into the allegations, leading the company to consider selling the under-construction casino, in case the investigation led to a negative outcome. The name of the project was changed to Encore Boston Harbor as part of an effort by Wynn Resorts to distance itself from Steve Wynn.
