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- Explore different disciplines through the core curriculum – many introductory (100-level) courses count as core requirements and towards specific majors. These courses can be a gateway to a major, minor, or area of interest. The 1-credit course, CAS 201 College to Career: Explore Your Options & Find your Path, is specifically designed to help you identify a major that aligns with your strengths, interests, and life goals.
- Visit the Center for Career Equity, Development, and Success and attend their events. The Center is host to 9 industry-aligned Career Communities designed to familiarize you with professional opportunities in various disciplines.
- Meet with an academic advisor. The Undergraduate Academic Advising Center offers appointments both in-person and via Zoom for your convenience. These advisors can help you identify your interests and create a course schedule that allows you to evaluate a variety of courses before deciding on a major program of study.
- Attend the Major and Minor Fair. This fair held during the middle of the fall semester provides students the opportunity to meet with faculty in all undergraduate disciplines, along with representatives from the Undergraduate Advising Center and the Career Center.
- Still not sure? The College of Arts & Sciences is home to a self-designed major pathway. In this pathway, students may design their own major by incorporating coursework and experiences from 2 or more majors into their course of study.
