Our academic program is designed to be systematic, cumulative and comprehensive. We do not require or expect students to have completed graduate work in clinical psychology elswhere before starting the doctoral program. Thus, we generally discourage students from attempting to transfer in coursework they may have completed in a master's or different doctoral program in lieu of taking a required core course at Suffolk. However, we are willing to review up to 6 credits of previous coursework to determine if a transfer is appropriate.
