Program Offerings Overview



Juris Doctor (JD)

Complete your JD in three years of full-time study, or four years part-time in the evening. **Apply by April 1st for priority consideration.**

Accelerated JD

Earn your JD with two years of full-time study—or three years part-time in the evening. **Apply by the first Tuesday in February.**

Advanced Professional Online JD (APO)

Fully online JD tailored for experienced professionals ready to take the next step in their careers. **Apply by the first Tuesday in February for priority consideration.**

Hybrid Online JD

Take your first 30 credit hours in-person, then take a mix of in-person or online classes for the remainder of your studies. **Apply by the first Tuesday in February for priority consideration.**

Dual Degrees

Fast-track your career by getting a master's degree while you earn your law degree. **Apply by April 1st, 2027 for priority consideration.**

3+3 Bachelor's/JD

Suffolk Law's 3+3 Program allows eligible undergraduates at partner institutions to apply to law school in their junior year of college. **Apply by April 1st, 2027 for priority consideration.**

Binding Early Decision Program

Are you ready to commit to attending Suffolk Law, in either May or August 2027?

Each student admitted through the Binding Early Decision Program becomes a Dean's Scholar and is guaranteed a full tuition scholarship. **Apply by December 1st.**

Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Scholarship

Have you completed your bachelors degree at an accredited HBCU?

The Thaddeus Alexander Kitchener Scholarship (HBCU Scholarship) is a binding, full-tuition scholarship for HBCU graduates. **Apply by March 1st.**
