Shorter Degree, Same *Suffolk Experience*

Students pursuing this exciting new degree program will have the same opportunities as four-year degree seekers. You can:

- participate fully in our 100+ student clubs and organizations, including our DIII sports teams.
- live on campus and receive a minimum \$2,500 housing grant for up to three years.
- receive financial aid, merit scholarships, work-study positions, and other funding opportunities.
- apply transfer credits and advanced credits from AP exams, IB exams, and dual enrollment programs.*

*Please note: Four-year, 120-credit programs remain the norm for bachelor's degrees. Some employers and graduate programs may not consider a three-year applied bachelor's program equivalent to a traditional four-year, 120-credit program.

This degree is highly structured. Students can choose to transition their applied bachelor's degree into a traditional bachelor's degree. That will, however, increase credit requirements and extend time to degree completion. Applied bachelor's students may also return to Suffolk to earn a four-year degree after completing this degree, but this will affect their eligibility for some federal financial aid programs. Transfer students are eligible to apply for the applied bachelor's degree; transfer credits will be considered on a case-by-case basis and may not significantly shorten the time to degree.
