

ADVANCED CREDIT INFORMATION

Suffolk awards advanced credit—which saves you time and money!—for a wide range of exam scores, including:

- Advanced Placement scores ranging from 3 to 5
- International Baccalaureate (IB): Higher Level (HL)
 exams with a score of 4 and above; Standard Level
 (SL) 5 and above. Sophomore standing is possible
 for IB Diploma recipients.
- A-Level scores of C- and higher (Five strong GCSE/ IGCSE passes are required for admission.)
- Other examinations such as the French Baccalaureate, German Abitur, Swiss Matura, and Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examination
- College/University courses completed with a C- or better. Courses must be similar in content to those at Suffolk and taken at an institution recognized by the Ministry of Education or by a U.S. regionally accredited institution.
